Gardening

By: The Farmers' Almanac August 2017

1st - **2**nd- Cut winter wood, do clearing and plowing, but no planting.

 $\mathbf{3^{rd}}$ - $\mathbf{5^{th}}$ A good time to plant aboveground crops.

6th - 7th Barren days, fine for killing plant pests.

8th - 10th Excellent for any vine crops such as beans, peas, and cucumbers. Good days for transplanting. Favorable days for planting root crops.

11th - 12th Neither plant nor sow on these barren days.

13th - 14th Good days for transplanting. Root crops that can be planted now will yield well.

15th - 16th Any seed planted now will tend to rot.

17th - 18th Plant seedbeds and flower gardens. Good days for transplanting. Most favorable days for planting beets, onions, turnips, and other root crops.

19th - 22nd Best for killing weeds, briars, poison ivy, and other plant pests. Clear wood lots and fencerows.

23rd - 25th Excellent for sowing grains, winter wheat, oats, and rye. Plant flowers. Good days for planting aboveground crops.

26th - 27th Plant seedbeds. Plant peas, beans, tomatoes, peppers, and other aboveground crops in southern Florida, California, and Texas. Extra good for leafy vegetables.

28th - 30th Cut winter wood, do clearing and plowing, but no planting.

31st A good time to plant aboveground crops.

1st -3rd Mostly fair skies. Hot and dry.

4th -7th Showers, then fair.

8th -11th Hot weather, especially over Texas.

12th -15th Generally fair skies.

16th -19th Fair skies.

20th -23rd Wet weather is followed by clearing conditions; not a good outlook for eclipse watchers.

24th -27th Thunderstorms; heavy to severe activity for New Mexico, Texas, and Arkansas.

28th -31st Mostly fair skies return.

Flooring History

Discovered by a French physician in the 19th century, the first experiments in vinyl began in the 1930's when it made its first public appearance at the 1933 exhibition "Century of Progress" in Chicago, USA. During the war years, due to difficulties in sourcing certain raw materials, research focused on exploiting vinyl as an alternative to rubber. The 1950's marked an era of creativity and experimentation with vinyl. Its characteristics - extreme durability, flexible handling, design possibilities – made it an attractive and cost-effective option for mass producing all kinds of industrial and household objects. Companies in North America and Europe began to manufacture vinyl flooring. The 1960's are synonymous with the growing popularity of vinyl which was being used everywhere - from building materials, car components, food packaging to medical equipment and even clothing. Worldwide vinyl production exploded from 220,000 tons per year in 1950 to 6 million tons by 1970. Vinyl flooring was appreciated for its resistance to moisture, stains and impact as well its durability over time. These technical qualities made it a highly popular and practical flooring in hospitals, schools, offices and housing across the world. In 1968, a vinyl flooring set the scene for the Winter Olympic prize ceremony covering the skating rink in Grenoble, France!
