Chicken & Dumplings

Ingredients

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
2 tablespoons butter
2 (10.75 ounce) cans condensed cream of chicken soup
1 onion, finely diced
2 (10 ounce) packages refrigerated biscuit dough, torn into pieces

Directions

1. Place the chicken, butter, soup, and onion in a slow cooker, and fill with enough water to cover.
2. Cover, and cook for 5 to 6 hours on High. About 30 minutes before serving, place the torn biscuit dough in the slow cooker. Cook until the dough is no longer raw in the center.

Flooring History

The laminate flooring history is surprisingly not that long! You may be surprised that laminate flooring has only been around for a few decades.

Rapidly gaining popularity due to its affordable price, ease of installation, and durable beauty, laminate flooring got its start in Sweden in the early 1920s when lamination was first developed. Lamination is composed of many layers, with a wood pulp being the core of it, held together with glue or resin and then cured with heat or pressure. Lamination creates a new material that is stronger than each of its components.

- 1st - 2nd** Plant flowers. Fine for sowing hay, fodder crops, and grains. Favorable days for planting root crops.
- 3rd - 4th** Start seedbeds. Good days for transplanting. Plant carrots, beets, onions, turnips, Irish potatoes, and other root crops in the South.
- 5th - 7th** Do no planting.
- 8th - 9th** Plant sweet corn, beans, peppers, and other aboveground crops where climate is suitable.
- 10th - 12th** Barren days. Fine for clearing, plowing, fertilizing, and killing plant pests.
- 13th - 14th** Extra good for cucumbers, peas, cantaloupes, and other vine crops. Plant peppers, sweet corn, tomatoes, and other aboveground crops in southern Florida, California, and Texas.
- 15th - 17th** A barren period.
- 18th - 19th** Fine for planting beans, peppers, cucumbers, melons, and other aboveground crops where climate is suitable.
- 20th - 21st** Seeds planted now tend to rot in ground.
- 22nd - 23rd** Start seedbeds and flower gardens. Good days for transplanting. Most favorable days for planting beets, onions, turnips, and other root crops where climate allows.
- 24th - 27th** A barren period. Favorable for killing plant pests, cultivating, or taking a short vacation.
- 28th - 29th** Plant flowers. Fine for sowing hay, fodder crops, and grains. Favorable days for planting root crops.
- 30th - 31st** Start seedbeds. Good days for transplanting. Plant carrots, beets, onions, turnips, Irish potatoes, and other root crops in the South.

- 1st - 3rd** Showers, flurries over Southern Plains to the Gulf Coast, then turning fair & cold.
- 4th - 7th** Heavy snow New Mexico, northern Texas/Oklahoma; frosts to Gulf Coast.
- 8th - 11th** Much colder. Snow New Mexico, Texas, southern Oklahoma.
- 12th - 15th** Snow Rockies, Plains.
